**Legislative Clerkships with the Anti-Defamation League**

The Anti-Defamation League is one of the nation's oldest human relations organizations dedicated to combating anti-Semitism and all forms of discrimination and promoting inter-group cooperation and interfaith understanding. Since 1913, ADL has been active in fighting discrimination in employment, housing, education and public accommodation. Currently the League is engaged in issues such as countering hate crimes, safeguarding church-state separation, developing anti-terrorism initiatives, and promoting support for the Middle East peace process.

The Government and National Affairs Office in Washington advances the League's policy goals in the nation's capital by identifying emerging issues as they take shape and crafting legislative and policy responses.

Legislative Clerkship responsibilities include:

The skills of legislative lawyers: Tracking legislation, attending Congressional hearings, representing ADL at coalition policy meetings, tracking and analyzing Supreme Court and lower court cases of interest to the League, legal research and writing for background on legislative and administrative initiatives.

Eligibility:

First, Second, and Third-year law students with an interest in ADL issues are encouraged to apply. Responsibilities are commensurate with experience.

Hours: Summer - full time

Fall and Spring Semester - Flexible to academic schedule

Modest stipend for summer clerkships only

Credit: Legislative Clerkships have earned academic credit from area law schools.
