Legislative Internships with the Anti-Defamation League

The Washington Office of the Anti-Defamation League is now taking applications for Legislative Internships/Clerkships for the Fall and Winter Semesters in the 2006-07 academic year and for Summer, 2007.

Founded in 1913, the Anti-Defamation League is one of the nation's oldest human relations organizations, dedicated in purpose and program to combating anti-Semitism and discrimination in all forms and promoting improved intergroup cooperation and interfaith understanding. ADL has helped lead the fight against discrimination in employment, housing, education, and public accommodation. ADL also work diligently on behalf of religious liberty and church-state separation.

The Washington Office is the national liaison for the Anti-Defamation League to Congress and the executive branch. Staff members in the Washington Office coordinate ADL's involvement in legislative initiatives and develop and implement policy on a wide range of domestic and international issues. Legislative Assistants and Legislative Law Clerks track legislation, attend Congressional hearings and coalition policy meetings, write legal and policy research memoranda, report on meetings and briefings, and help track cases now pending before the Supreme Court in which ADL is formally involved or has an interest.

Priority issues for the League at this time include countering hate violence, protecting religious liberty, expanding and protecting civil and voting rights, comprehensive immigration reform, safeguarding church-state separation, promoting Middle East peace, and developing legislative initiatives to counter and deter domestic and international terrorist threats.

Law Students, Graduate Students, and Undergrads are welcome to apply; responsibilities are commensurate with experience. Many former Legislative Assistants and Law Clerks have also received academic credit. Summer Legislative Assistants and Law Clerks receive a modest stipend.
