Background Information on the Corporation for National and Community Service

The Corporation for National and Community Service is the umbrella federal government independent agency that sponsors volunteer service programs, including: the AmeriCorps service program, which includes national and state grant programs, VISTA and the National Civilian Community Corps; the National Senior Service Corps (Foster Grandparents, Senior Companions and the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program); and Service-Learning.

Our mission is to engage Americans of all backgrounds in community-based service in partnership with state and local governments and non-profit organizations. This service addresses the nation's education, public safety, human and environmental needs to achieve direct and demonstrable results. In doing so, the Corporation fosters civic responsibility, encourages civic engagement, and provides educational opportunity for those who make a substantial commitment to service.

The Department of Research & Policy Development

The Department of Research & Policy Development is part of the CEO's office and is responsible for conducting research projects and evaluation studies designed to shape policy within the Corporation for National and Community Service, as well as key elements of President Bush's USA Freedom Corps initiative. The Department of Research & Policy Development is also responsible for preparing the Corporation's annual performance plans and reports to Congress.

Activities & Duties

Interns work at the Corporation headquarters, located at 1201 New York Ave., NW. Interns provide staff support to Research Associates, Research Analysts and Policy Analysts who are responsible for managing and conducting research and evaluation projects, measuring the performance of Corporation programs, and reporting to Congress on the agency's performance plans and reports.

Eligibility

We seek individuals with research, policy, evaluation statistical analysis and / or nonprofit / program management experience or interest obtained through school or work. Student's who are pursuing degrees in the social sciences, such economics, political science, sociology, anthropology, psychology, history, public administration, and public policy, are encouraged to apply.
