The University of California Washington Center (UCDC) invites applications for a visiting instructor position in its undergraduate academic program **for the academic year 2016-17 with the possibility of a one year renewal.**

UCDC is a system-wide academic program of the University of California in Washington, DC that provides opportunities for undergraduates to study and participate in public service, media, science policy and arts internships in Washington, DC for a quarter or semester. Additionally, students carry a semester or quarter course load of academic work including participation in one of several research seminars and elective courses. Courses are designed to supplement student's internship experience and/or to take advantage of the many unique opportunities available in our Nation's capital.

Because of the unique character of the Washington Center program, the instructor position is **open as to specialization**, with a few caveats. All candidates should be able to teach a general research seminar for undergraduates. Candidates specializing in American politics and policy should be able to teach some combination of courses addressing institutions, behavior, media and politics, political communication, public policy, or public advocacy and nonprofit studies. Candidates specializing in international relations and global studies should be able to teach some combination of courses addressing foreign policy, national defense and security studies, global governance, global affairs, or human rights.

Applicants must demonstrate significant professional and/or practitioner experience in the areas of specialization listed above. Preference will be given to applicants who hold a PhD and have demonstrated effectiveness in the classroom.

This is a full-time, non-tenure track position and does not imply any academic standing with other University of California campuses or departments. Terms and conditions of employment are subject to UC policy. Teaching positions are in Washington, DC at the Washington Center. Salary is commensurate with experience.
